History corner



Ismail Pasha, Khedive of Egypt and the Sudan, formally opened the Suez Canal on November 17, 1869. Officially, the first ship to navigate through the canal was the imperial yacht of French Empress, Eugenie.



On November 11th, 2018 the US and Canada celebrate the last day of World War One, known as Armistice Day. Despite November 11th being the last day of the war, on many parts of the Western Front fighting continued as normal.



On November 22, 1990, British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher resigned after 11 years in office, the longest term of any British Prime Minister in the 20th century.



After discovering debris-covered stairs, British archaeologist Howard Carter and his crew entered the four-room Egyptian tomb of 18-year-old King Tutankhamen on November 26, 1922.



In Finland they call November marraskuu, which means month of the dead.



On November 24th we celebrate International Evolution Day in commemoration of Charles Darwin's publication of "On the Origin of Species" in 1859.



International Day for Tolerance on November 16th is an annual observance day declared by UNESCO in 1995 to generate public awareness of the dangers of intolerance.

Iceland Airwaves – Reykjavik, Iceland, November 2-5



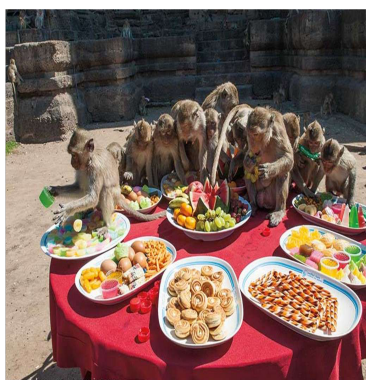
A 4-day music festival that takes place in **Reykjavik, Iceland** every November. The festival was first created in 1999 and held in an airport hangar, but has since become the **biggest music festival in Iceland**.

Lewes Bonfire – Lewes, England, November 5

In the town of **Lewes in Sussex, England**, on Guy Fawkes Night on November 5th 1606, a bonfire was lit in commemoration of the Gunpowder Plot and to honour the seventeen protestant men for their faith during the Marian Persecutions.



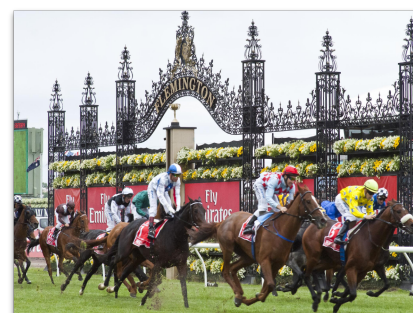
Monkey Buffet Festival, Lopburi, Thailand, November 27



The mischievous monkeys are honoured with their very own banquet on the **last Sunday of November each year**. More than 10,000 people, both locals and tourists, flock to **San Phra Kan shrine** and in **Phra Prang Sam Yot shrine**, the unofficial gathering point of the local macaque monkeys.

Melbourne Cup, Melbourne, Australia, November 1

It is the **biggest horse race** and is billed as the 'race that stops a nation'. Held at **Flemington Racecourse**, the day consists of 10 races in total. The Melbourne Cup is Race 7 held at 3pm, where 24 horses compete over 3,200 metres (2 miles).



Thanks giving around the world



The annual Thanksgiving holiday tradition in the United States is documented at its earliest in **1619**, in what is now called the Commonwealth of Virginia. Thirty-eight English settlers aboard the ship Margaret arrived by way of the James River at Berkeley Hundred in Charles City County, Virginia on December 4, 1619.



Second Monday in October
Canada's first Thanksgiving celebration actually predates America's—by more than 40 years.



First Sunday in October
The German equivalent of Thanksgiving is Erntedankfest ("harvest festival of thanks"), a religious holiday.



The first Thursday of November
Freed slaves from the United States established Liberia in the early 1820s with help from the American Colonization Society so it makes sense that they celebrate this tradition.



July-August
Crop over Festival Barbados
The festival tradition started way back in 1688 with a ceremonial delivery of the last canes, followed by the presentation of harvest crowns to the man and woman who produced the most sugarcane.



Fourth Thursday of November, Leiden, The Netherlands
The people of today's Leiden continue to celebrate their ties with the Mayflower's passengers by holding non-denominational church services.



Fourth Thursday of November, Puerto Rico
Puerto Ricans have put their own twist on the traditional Thanksgiving Day feast: in addition to the turkey, roast pork is also a common item on the menu, accompanied with more plantains, rice and beans.

Raechel`s Bakery Tips



I would like to introduce "Panque", a bakery tucked away in a small neighborhood located in Nakahiro. "Panque" is a bakery that specifically caters to bagel lovers, offering all sorts of flavor varieties, from plain, to cinnamon raisin, and even coffee jelly. Not only do they sell bagels, but they also carry a small selection of pretzels, including kinako-covered and salted pretzels. On my last trip, I picked up a pepper ham bagel sandwich. I was pleasantly surprised when I bit into the soft, chewy bagel dough which made a delightful contrast with the seasoned ham and aromatic cheese in the sandwich. I followed up with a crunchy cheese pretzel, a refined version of the pretzels I'd have as a kid, with a more moderate coating of butter and filled with gouda cheese. The shop is run by a young couple, and they sell out of goods rather quick! So, if you consider yourself a bagel fanatic, make sure to pay "Panque" a visit and indulge in a helping or two!
