









June 26-30, Glastonbury Music Festival

June Juniper Berry-Crusted Venison with Mostarda

To make this decadent meal simply combine 1/3 of a cup of juniper berries, 50 ml of oil, 2 tbsp of salt, 2 tbsp of whole black peppercorns, 1 tbsp of caraway seeds and 1 tbsp of coriander seeds in a food processor; pulse them into a wet, gravel-like consistency. Set it aside and prepare the meat.

Add 60 ml of oil and 1 tbsp of unsalted butter to an oven-proof skillet and brown the seasoned venison in it over medium-high heat for 8-10 minutes, turning it as needed.

Then, coat with the juniper berry mixture and roast it in the oven at 250°C for about 30 minutes, until medium-rare. Let it rest for 5 minutes before carving.

Serve with a Mostarda: whisk together 250 grams of sugar, ½ of a cup of cider vinegar, 3 tbsp of ground mustard, 3 tbsp of yellow mustards seeds, 1½ tsp of ground cinnamon and 2 cups of water in a saucepan. Stir in the zest of an orange, 1 tsp of grated ginger, ¼ of a cup of dried cherries, 1 cup of cranberries (frozen or fresh), ¼ of a cup of dried currants and 2 pears, peeled, seeded and diced. Boil this for about 45 minutes on medium heat until pears are tender and the liquid is thickened.

Let it cool before drizzling it on top of your venison.
