Panafest, Ghana Cape Coast



July Julienne Carrot Salad

This simple, refreshing salad comes together in only 3 steps: you prepare 450 gr of carrot by peeling them and cutting them into thin matchsticks. Then, in a bowl you toss them with 3 tablespoons of extra-virgin olive oil, 2 tablespoons of lemon juice, 1 grated clove of garlic, 1/2 of a teaspoon of cumin seeds, 1/2 of a teaspoon of coriander seeds, a pinch of ground Cayenne and salt and pepper to taste until well coated. Leave it to marinate for 10 to 15 minutes. Adjust seasoning before serving and sprinkle with preserved lemon and garnish with mint leaves.
